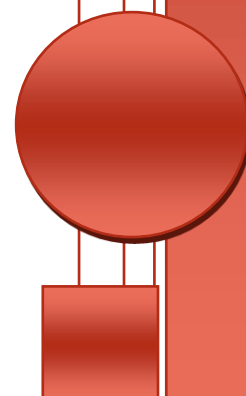

1) INTRODUCTION & LEGAL FRAMEWORK

The compilation of this Oversight Report is undertaken in compliance with the requirements of Section 129(1) of the Municipal Finance Management Act, Act 56 of 2003 (MFMA). This section of the Act prescribes that a municipal council must consider the municipality's Annual Report and subsequently refer it to the Municipal Public Accounts Committee or another designated oversight structure for detailed review. Following this review process, the committee is required to compile an Oversight Report containing its findings, observations, and recommendations for consideration by Council.

The Oversight Report serves as Council's formal response to the Annual Report and forms an integral part of the municipal accountability cycle. Through this process, Council exercises its responsibility to evaluate the District Municipality's financial management, governance practices and overall institutional performance during the financial year under review.

Upon consideration of the Oversight Report, Council is required to adopt a resolution that clearly indicates its position regarding the Annual Report. In terms of the MFMA, Council must determine whether it:

- Approves the Annual Report, with or without reservations;
- Rejects the Annual Report; or
- Refers the Annual Report back for revision of specific components that may be amended.

The provisions of Section 129 therefore establish an important governance mechanism that enables Council to fulfil its oversight responsibilities, while also ensuring transparency, accountability and responsible management of public resources within the District Municipality.

2) PURPOSE

The Annual Report is an important accountability document that provides a comprehensive overview of the District Municipality's financial and non-financial performance for the previous financial year. It serves to inform Council, stakeholders and the public on how municipal resources were managed and the

extent to which the District Municipality achieved its planned objectives and service delivery commitments.

The Oversight Report, on the other hand, represents Council's formal assessment of the Annual Report. In terms of Section 129(1) of the Municipal Finance Management Act, Council must consider the Annual Report and adopt an Oversight Report that records its comments, findings and recommendations. Together, these reports strengthen transparency, accountability and good governance within the District Municipality.

3) THE PURPOSE AND FUNCTIONS MUNICIPAL PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE

The Municipal Public Accounts Committee (MPAC) plays a central role in strengthening accountability and transparency within the municipal governance system. Its primary purpose is to assist Council in exercising effective oversight over the financial management, performance reporting and governance practices of the District Municipality. Through its work, the Committee contributes to ensuring that municipal resources are managed responsibly and that the administration remains accountable for its actions and decisions.

MPAC is established by Council in terms of Section 79 of the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act, 117 of 1998. This provision empowers municipal Councils to appoint committees consisting of councillors to perform specific oversight functions on behalf of Council. In this capacity, MPAC functions as a specialized oversight committee that supports Council in reviewing matters relating to financial performance, audit outcomes and institutional accountability.

As part of its mandate, the Committee examines key accountability documents of the District Municipality, including the Annual Report and other financial and performance-related reports. It interrogates the information presented by the administration, considers audit findings and compliance matters and identifies areas where improvement or corrective action may be required. The outcomes of this process are recorded in the Oversight Report, which is submitted to Council for consideration and adoption.

Through these responsibilities, MPAC strengthens Council's ability to exercise independent oversight over municipal operations, while promoting sound

Service delivery collapse reaches crisis point

The Democratic Alliance (DA), together with local residents, has issued a formal notice of demand to the mayor of Ga-Segonyana local municipality Councillor George Neo Masagela, compelling him to take immediate action to halt and reverse the systemic collapse of basic service delivery in Kuruman. This is according to DA Councillor Braam van der Westhuizen from the Ga-Segonyana local municipality.

The situation has deteriorated to crisis levels, amounting to a grave violation of constitutional rights, public health standards and a gross dereliction of the municipality's statutory duties.

Raw sewage continues to flow through public streets due to the sustained failure to repair and upgrade sanitation infrastructure. Residents endure prolonged water outages, sometimes lasting up to five days, while major leaks are left unattended for as long as 18 months, resulting in severe water losses and significant revenue depletion.

Public roads are in a state of advanced decay. Water-filled potholes conceal their depth, while collapsing culverts pose a serious danger to motorists.

Electrical poles are collapsing across the

town, leaving live wires draped over trees and into residents' yards, placing especially children's lives at immediate risk.

The municipality remains incapable of providing prepaid water and electricity meters, while residents are burdened with persistently inflated and incorrect bills.

Uncontrolled overgrowth of weeds and vegetation obstruct road markings, signage and visibility. Broken traffic lights further contribute to unsafe conditions and enable criminal activity.

Despite repeated complaints and formal reports by the DA, the municipality has demonstrated sustained inaction, a lack of accountability and a complete failure to communicate timeously with residents. Council meetings have also descended into disorder and intimidation, with no consequences imposed. This pattern reflects administrative negligence, political indifference and institutional collapse.

In response, the DA submitted the following urgent demands to the mayor during last week's council meeting: Immediate cessation of all sewage spills and emergency repairs to sanitation systems. Restoration of a

continuous, reliable supply of potable water. Rehabilitation of roads, hazardous potholes and collapsing culverts. Clearing of overgrown vegetation, repair of traffic lights, restoration of road markings and replacement of damaged signage. Implementation of consequence management against employees involved in the unauthorised disruption of council meetings. Rectification of all incorrect billing and the rollout of functional prepaid water and electricity meters.

The mayor had until 12 February 2026 to submit a written action plan with timelines, which must be presented to residents at a community meeting to be convened in Kuruman.

The DA will continue to pursue every available legal, political and community-based avenue to protect the rights of residents and to compel the municipality to fulfil its constitutional and statutory obligations. Should the mayor fail to meet the deadline with a credible and actionable plan, the DA will take further steps in their fight to ensure accountability and the restoration of basic services in Kuruman.

AfriForum demands answers re Kuruman water supply crisis

Civil rights organisation AfriForum has called on the Northern Cape premier Dr Zama Saul, the JTG district municipality, the South African Human Rights Commission (SAHRC) and other parties to address the water supply problem in Kuruman.

This follows after residents from The Eye and surrounding areas were left without water numerous times during the past 2 weeks without reasons being provided.

Initially AfriForum wrote to the Ga-Segonyana local municipality requesting feed back within 24 hours providing answers relating to the causes of the water supply challenges as well as possible remedies.

The organisation also approached the Northern Cape Department of Cooperative Government, Human Settlements and Traditional Affairs (COGHSTA) and the Northern Cape Department of Water and Sanitation to get on board and call the municipality

to order.

Residents of The Eye told AfriForum that at times they had to go without water for 5 days on end. Water supply is a basic human right and should water supply be intermittent, the impact on households, business, schools and health facilities is enormous. It is suspected that water cuts are caused and exacerbated, amongst others, by power cuts affecting water pumps, failing to restart pumps after restoring power supply and management challenges at the municipality.

AfriForum requests amongst others that authorities investigate the water supply in Kuruman, especially The Eye area. Furthermore, the organisation also requested ensuring that immediate remedial actions are implemented to fix and stabilise the water supply.

"It is extremely disconcerting that Kuruman, after Uptington, is now the second Northern Cape town, within a week strug-

gling with a water crisis. It points to a larger systemic problem in the management and maintenance of water infrastructure in the province," remarked Lize-Mari Smit, AfriForum District Coordinator Karoo.

AfriForum emphasised that access to water constitutes a constitutional right and that repeated service delivery failures cannot be regarded as incidental or isolated cases.

"We allowed the Ga-Segonyana municipality 24 hours to respond to our request. It seems as though they do not regard the challenges faced by the residents seriously. We are left with no other option but to approach the premier, other provincial authorities and the SAHRC to take action to secure reliable water supply to the residents of Kuruman. Should water supply not improve, AfriForum will take further steps," concluded Ms Smit.

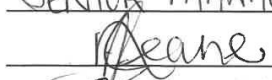

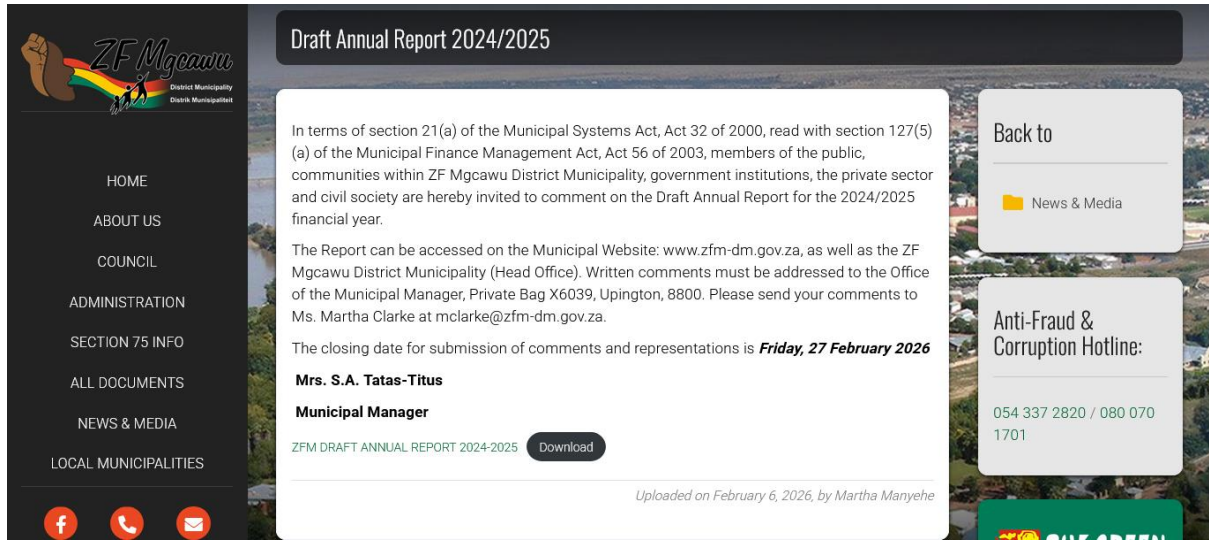
